MUNICIPAL COSMETIC PESTICIDE BANS

All pesticides must be registered in Canada. Registrations are administered under Health Canada by the Pest Management Regulatory Agency (PMRA), within federal legislation called the Pest Control Products Act (PCPA). Pesticides for use by the homeowner are registered as "Domestic" products. Farmers, landscapers, etc., use pesticides registered as "Commercial". It is illegal for Commercial pesticides to be used by homeowners.

As a supplier of Commercial agricultural and horticultural pesticides, we do not stock or sell domestic pesticides for home use. So, if you are a homeowner, we will not be able to help you with cosmetic weed or pest control products or inquiries.

Ask your <u>local garden centre</u> for information and options to control weeds and other cosmetic lawn and garden concerns.
